The information on the propeller conversion you seek is contained only in US Air Force T.O.s, which are listed as follows:

Hamilton Standard cannot supply the above manuals to you. You can obtain them from the military base nearest you through the freedom of information act.

The 43H60-603 propellers were installed on the subject aircraft to solve an Air Force logistics problem, when Allison-Detroit Diesel- Aeroproducts Div. decided to no longer support the propeller on this aircraft. The Air Force had in its inventory many of the Hamilton Standard Propellers and decided to install this propeller on the C-119.

The Aeroproducts propeller was an Integral Oil Control System so the conversion required that the 43H60 system be converted to an Integral Oil Control System too.

We regret that we are unable to supply photographs or drawings. There should be suffucuent material in the T.O.s listed.
