Thanks again to Jerry McDonald and all his volunteers—Branson will never be the same!



2008 AC-119 Gunship Association Minutes

After the opening invocation by Chaplin Larry Hunter and the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance, President Vern Hansen called the 2008 Annual meeting of the AC-119 Gunship Association to order at 0900 on Saturday, September 13, at the Radisson Hotel in Branson, MO. Approximately 100 Association members were present.

Secretary's Report: members approved the 2007 Association Meeting Minutes as posted on web. Jim Alvis reported our membership has leveled off at 420 Association members, with increasing Life & decreasing Annual memberships resulting in reduced future revenue from dues.

Points Of Contact: great work with everyone present having received some contact last year. Board will work to increase contacts via POCs & Newsletter in 2009.

"Undeliverable" e-mail returns & snail-mailed Newsletters: please update your e-mail if it changes. It results in extra work for our volunteers & snail mails that cost our Association \$\$ that we'd rather spend on reunion activities & history efforts. We snail mail 116 Newsletters due to undeliverable or no e-mail.

Treasurer's Report: Doug Wohlgamuth reported that after last year's reunion, we had \$14,443. Branson Reunion costs for Thursday Branson Belle, Friday Social, Saturday Banquet, Sunday BBQ, Hootch for 4 days, & videography for 4 days was \$31,787, after merchandise costs/sales, dues, Reunion Fees, & raffles, we expect to have about \$13,000 next year.

History Book: Larry Fletcher & Ralph LeFarth discussed the status of the history book project. One of the largest hurdles is the cost of having the book printed. One solution is to contact all Gunship Association members via the POCs & determine who would pledge or prepay \$50 per copy toward the printing cost of the history book, & how many copies the individual would want to purchase. The majority of the members present indicated they would pledge or prepay the cost per copy to speed up the process. We will communicate pledge/prepay options to members very soon. Members should also consider extra copies for their local libraries or other repositories. Note: we took reservations for 20 History Books during the Reunion. Another challenge is the follow-up on missing info, identifying photo locations or people, as well as the proofing & editing of submitted materials. Larry & Ralph need assistants to help in these roles. George Carter, Pete Chamberlain, Allen Chandler, Don Craig, Phil Diehl, Chuck James, Wayne Laessig, Larry McManus, & Howie Reid volunteered & Larry will ask Bill Petrie to continue as proof reader. We will have a History Book at the next Reunion. There will be a deadline for biographies, stories, and pictures. Not meeting it might mean non-inclusion in the History Book.

We also need video transcribers who can transcribe our DVDs, interviews, or mission tapes. Volunteers, please contact Wayne Laessig at 707-592-4492 or Qadvocate@sbcglobal.net.

Association's official history repository: We confirmed Texas Tech University (TTU) Official repository only means the Association members believe TTU provides the best combination of protecting documents while providing access. It is not a mandatory repository - just very good & our recommended choice. TTU created an AC-119 Gunship Collection within which every member can create their own individual collection in their own name, with biographies & any other information or documents they want to contribute. TTU makes digital copies, archives & maintains your documents, & they are accessible via the TTU website. We'll post information on how to make donations on our Association website.

AC-27 J "Stinger": Howie Reed discussed this new Air Force gunship & its similarities to the AC-119K. Mac MacIsaac discussed that the squadron designation for the AC-27J could be the 17th or 18th SOS. Howie is the PQC on this project. Anyone having input or info, please send it to him.

Awards & Decorations: Any gunshipper who was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross is encouraged to join the DFC Society. Their link is www.dfcsociety.org or check our Associations' Awards & Decorations website link. Mac MacIsaac warned us to NEVER send original documents to a government agency - send a notarized copy instead.

Association activities:

Possible AC-119 aircraft survived: there was much discussion about a possible AC-119 located at Tan Son Nhut, AB Vietnam & the possibility of recovery. Chuck Williams, Wayne Laessig, & Lee Kyser discussed the possibilities, & Lee will be the POC of this project. Anyone having input or info, please send it to him.

Commemorative Rifle & Pistol Set: Ron Soderquist built & donated a commemorative rifle & pistol. We discussed & agreed these one-of-a kind guns should remain as a set. They will be raffled next reunion as a set, with one winner. We are offering raffle tickets at \$10 donation for one, 6 tickets for \$50, & 13 tickets for \$100. (see page 14 of this Newsletter) for pictures and info on the set. We will offer raffle tickets all year; you do not have to be present to win.

Air Force Enlisted Village(AFEV): Garry Gourley, Gus Sininger, Wayne Laessig, & Lt Col Jon Peck, (current 18th FLTS Commander) coordinated the donation & presentation of our Shadow & Stinger lithographs to the Village. The AFEV's CEO, Retired CMSgt of the Air Force Binnicker, accepted the lithos & they hang in the entry to Teresa Village Activity Hall. Articles were published in the AFEV Newsletter, Eglin AFB Newsletter, & local press. Great work!

Active Duty 71st SOS & 18th FLTS squadron contacts: We added current 71st & 18th active duty Squadron Commanders to our Honorary Memberships & we will contact the 17th SOS Commander shortly. Each Commander has responded with a strong desire to maintain their link with our heritage. Jim Alvis & Herman "Al" Heuss continued to build our relationship with the current active duty 71st SOS, attending Command Changes, and assuring we contact the incoming Commanders to maintain our heritage.

Gus Sininger re-established our relationship with the 18th FLTS Commander, attending Commander Calls, & coordinating their Commander's participation in the AFEV presentation. We also learned that Tony Pakutinski & Lt Col Peck (the 18th FLTS Commander) flew together on AC-130s some years ago & both are now AC-119 Gunship Association members!

We have info on the current 17th SOS Commander (MC-130 Squadron in Kadena) and we will contact them.

Stinger Monument: We're working to request a filter on the sprinkling system in the Hurlburt Air Memorial Park. As soon as it's installed, the Monument folks will redo our Monument to its original color & luster.

British Modeling journalist & magazine (there are world-wide organizations for model builders & hobbyists). Glen Sands of Britain is building an AC-119 model & writing a story for a British Modeling magazine. We provided as much data & pictures as we have & we will let everyone know when they publish the story.

Newsletter: Tony Pakutinski is taking this role to give Bill Petrie additional time to focus on our website.

Flags: We will try to obtain Battle & Campaign Streamers for our Squadron flags. A proposal was made to create an Association flag in addition to the three squadron flags. Motion carried, and a proposal was also made to create an AC-47 flag. Motion carried. Gus Sininger and Gary Gourley will work the association flag. Sam Tolbert will look into getting the AC-47 flag(s). Mac MacIsaac will coordinate with Lt Col Jon Peck (18th FLTS/CC) to complete the needed Battle & Campaign Streamer paperwork and other requirements for all our Squadrons.

Suggestion to changing our name to "Radial Engine Gunship Association". Motion not carried.

Next: We discussed the location for reunion X. Proposal for Fort Walton Beach included \$115 and \$135 rooms with breakfast included. Gus Sininger designated as coordinator. Bill Dudley offered an alternate proposal for St. Augustine, FL to take advantage of the 40th anniversary of the delivery of our AC-119s after Fairchild-Hiller modified them there. He has a hotel with \$97 rooms that includes breakfasts; a 1-day free trolley tour (downtown tour plus on-off all day); & a Northup-Grumman tour. Given the one-time anniversary opportunity & the facts that FWB numbers are lower than our other sites, the members voted overwhelmingly to select St. Augustine, FL for our 2009 Reunion X, & Bill Dudley will be the reunion coordinator.

Reunion X - St. Augustine, FL - Highlights and Information

Just a brief update to keep everyone up to speed. I have meetings scheduled tomorrow with the 1) Visitors and Convention Bureau, 2) Northrop-Grumman, and 3) Hotel Management. I will begin laying out all the requirements with the Hotel management. I had a Navy event at that hotel this past weekend and the service was outstanding. I met with the Suncruz Casino people yesterday and they are very anxious to put together a good package for us. I did an all day trip with them about two years ago and it was superb. They send a bus down from Mayport to pick you up, take you directly to the ship, free passes for the day which includes lunch, drinks are very modestly priced. You go off shore several miles and then cruise south. It's a lot of fun and lots of gambling for anyone so inclined.

Visitors and Convention Bureau: I will be asking them for the free passes for all our folks to all the attractions in the city as well as free trolley passes for Thurs-Sun. Impossible to see everything in one day so you can go back on the trolley the following days to see other attractions. A very popular event for those who may have an interest is the nightly ghost tour. St. Augustine is a beautiful city at night, especially along the Bayfront and the ghost tour is a walking tour along the bay area. I have asked the V&C folks for a DVD of the area which I will pass along to Bill Petrie to be loaded on the website.

Northrop Grumman: I plan to have an escorted tour through the factory at NG. This plant is currently building the latest version of the E-2 Hawkeye for the Navy as well as many other integrated systems. As we tour the facility, I will be pointing out the line flow when the C-119G was converted to the AC-119G/K. All the hangers, flight line area, and runways are exactly as they were when the Gunship was produced here.

Jalaram Hotels: The management is prepared to turn over the complete hotel for the reunion. The Hooch area and hotel rooms are not a problem for guests and the rate is \$95 per night. We have lots of convention space in this town for the two major events, our welcoming social and banquet, and it's all nearby the hotel. This hotel is in the heart of the city so it makes it convenient.

Other Activities: Golf is a favorite past time in the St. Augustine area and we have the World Golf Hall of Fame here. This will be one of the side trips I will be working on to acquire special passes for all the golfers who may want to visit the Golf Hall of Fame or play the two pro courses. Fishing charters are also available directly from the downtown city Marina for 1/2 day and full day trips for anyone interested. Cape Canaveral is about 1.5 hour drive down I-95 and day trips are available. I will update everyone periodically as I meet with different groups and finalize details. My intent is to comply with Gunship Association policy and make this a rememberable experience for everyone who attends.


